Lifelong Commitment to Discipleship

For some of us, this year’s Labor Day came way too early. No surprise, then, that this weekend’s scriptures seem to address our post-summer fatigue. For instance, Wisdom reminds us that believers in God can never be content with “timid deliberations” and “unsure plans.” Paul tells longtime friend and follower Philemon to “let the good you do be voluntary.” Jesus instructs “great crowds” traveling with him—including us—on three things necessary for all true disciples to accomplish. On this early autumn weekend, our scriptures describe disciples’ lifelong labors.

TODAY’S READINGS:

First Reading — You sent your holy spirit from on high and thus were the paths of those on earth made straight (Wisdom 9:13-18b).
Psalm — In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge (Psalm 90).
Second Reading — Paul asks Philemon to accept back his slave Onesimus as a brother (Philemon 9-10, 12-17).
Gospel — Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost to see if there is enough for its completion? (Luke 14:25-33).
