THE RICHNESS OF THE SPIRIT

Students, and most adults recalling their school days, are familiar with the phrase “compare and contrast” that shows up from time to time on tests. Today we hear two different accounts of the giving of the Holy Spirit to the church. Let’s contrast, then compare. Luke’s account from Acts is filled with arresting details: the mighty wind from heaven, the tongues of flame, the miracle of different languages. John’s account seems timid: fearful disciples, the wounded Christ, the expelling of breath from his risen body, not from the sky. Our literal, modern minds wonder which way it happened; our noisy culture probably makes us prefer the former. But if we compare the two, we find that the dazzling richness of the Spirit fills both accounts, for it is the very breath of the risen Christ, ascended to the sky in Luke, that appears to his disciples in John and sends his followers forth to carry on his mission of forgiving sin and proclaiming the mighty acts of God.

First Reading — Filled with the Holy Spirit, the apostles begin to speak in tongues (Acts 2:1-11).

Psalm — Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth (Psalm 104).

Second Reading — In one Spirit we are baptized into one body and given to drink of one Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13).

Gospel — Jesus Christ appears to the disciples and sends them on their mission with the power to forgive or retain sins through the Holy Spirit (John 20:19-23).

Parishioners are now allowed to enter the Church and attend Mass in person. Our weekend Mass schedule has returned to pre-Covid times with Vigil at 5:00 pm and Sunday Masses being: 7:00 am Vietnamese Mass, 8:30 a.m., 11:00 a.m., and 5:00 p.m. Our weekday Masses will return to their pre-Covid times as well. **All Masses will be held in the Church. Guidelines for Attending Mass

Good News: parishioners are allowed to attend Mass in the Church! Here are important things to remember/observe:

1. NO ONE (clergy or laity) is to attend Mass if they feel sick. If you had Covid-19 you cannot return to Mass unless you've received two negative tests and/or 14 days of no symptoms.
2. A general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass remains in effect.
3. Social distancing of 6 feet is required in Church, unless living in the same household. Only every other pew is being used, please do not remove blue tape. We are only able to hold 90 people in the Church. Families wishing to sit together must arrive together. All overflow will be directed to the school gymnasium to attend the Mass via livestream (Holy Communion will be brought over as well). Social distancing is to be observed in the gym as well.
4. The Hymnals and Missals have been removed. There is no printed bulletin (online version only).
5. The use of masks is **strongly** encouraged. All Ushers, EM's, Deacons, and Priests will be wearing masks.
6. Offertory baskets will not be passed. Baskets on poles will be used instead.
7. Silent prayer during the sign of peace.
No shaking hands.
8. The Precious Blood will not be distributed (no chalices).
9. There will be only one Communion line down the center isle, with social distancing.

10. Communion will not be distributed with gloves. The celebrant is to take care that he does not touch the communicant. If he does, he must re-sanitize his hands.
11. We will depart from the Church by dismissal as to maintain social distancing. Please, no congregating at the front doors. This space must be free and clear for those exiting Church.
12. Pews and common surfaces will be disinfected between Masses.

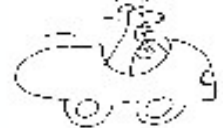
