

FOOD FROM HEAVEN



God sustained the people of Israel for forty years in the desert with manna sent down from heaven, and Moses doesn't want them to forget it. God brought forth water from stone for them to drink, and Moses doesn't want them to forget this, either. And Moses tells them—twice that the food that God sent was a food that neither they nor their ancestors before them had ever experienced before. Jesus too speaks of food come down from heaven, food that the Jewish people had never experienced before. Recalling the manna in the desert, Jesus doesn't want them to forget it either, explaining that he is the food and drink of eternal life. And Paul reiterates to the Corinthians and to all of us that in the bread and in the cup, we share in the body and blood of Christ.

TODAY'S READINGS:	 First Reading – Never forget the LORD your God, who brought you out of slavery (Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a). Psalm – Praise the Lord, Jerusalem (Psalm 147). Second Reading – Because the loaf of bread is one, we who partake of it, though we are many, are one body (1 Corinthians 10:16-17). Gospel – Jesus said, "I am the living bread; whoever eats this bread will live forever" (John 6:51-58).

Guidelines for Attending Mass

Good News: parishioners are allowed to attend Mass in the Church! Here are important things to remember/observe:

- NO ONE (clergy or laity) is to attend Mass if they feel sick. If you had Covid-19 you cannot return to Mass unless you've received two negative tests and/or 14 days of no symptoms.
 - 2. A general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass remains in effect.
- 3. Social distancing of 6 feet is required in Church, unless living in the same household. Only every other pew is being used, please do not remove blue tape. We are only able to hold 90 people in the Church. Families wishing to sit together must arrive together. All overflow will be directed to the school gymnasium to attend the Mass via livestream (Holy Communion will be brought over as well). Social distancing is to be observed in the gym as well.
- 4. The Hymnals and Missals have been removed. There is no printed bulletin (online version only).
 - 5. The use of masks is **strongly** encouraged. All Ushers, EM's, Deacons, and Priests <u>will</u> be wearing masks.
- 6. Offertory baskets will not be passed. Baskets on poles will be used instead.
- 7. Silent prayer during the sign of peace. No shaking hands.
 - 8. The Precious Blood will not be distributed (no chalices).
- 9. There will be only one Communion line down the center isle, with social distancing.

10. Communion will not be distributed with gloves. The celebrant is to take care that he does not touch the communicant. If he does, he must re-sanitize his hands.

11. We will depart from the Church by dismissal as to maintain social distancing. Please, no congregating at the front doors. This space must be free and clear for those exiting Church.

12. Pews and common surfaces will be disinfected between Masses.
