

Guidelines for Attending Mass

Good News: parishioners are allowed to attend Mass in the Church! Here are important things to remember/observe:

- 1. NO ONE (clergy or laity) is to attend Mass if they feel sick. If you had Covid-19 you cannot return to Mass unless you've received two negative tests and/or 14 days of no symptoms.
 - 2. A general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass remains in effect.
- 3. Social distancing of 6 feet is required in Church, unless living in the same household. Only every other pew is being used, please do not remove blue tape. We are only able to hold 90 people in the Church. Families wishing to sit together must arrive together. All overflow will be directed to the school gymnasium to attend the Mass via livestream (Holy Communion will be brought over as well). Social distancing is to be observed in the gym as well.
- 4. The Hymnals and Missals have been removed. There is no printed bulletin (online version only).
 - 5. The use of masks is strongly encouraged. All Ushers, EM's, Deacons, and Priests will be wearing masks.
- 6. Offertory baskets will not be passed. Baskets on poles will be used instead.
- 7. Silent prayer during the sign of peace. No shaking hands.
 - 8. The Precious Blood will not be distributed (no chalices).
- **9.** There will be only one Communion line down the center isle, with social distancing.

10. Communion will not be distributed with gloves. The celebrant is to take care that he does not touch the communicant. If he does, he must re-sanitize his hands.

11. We will depart from the Church by dismissal as to maintain social distancing. Please, no congregating at the front doors. This space must be free and clear for those exiting Church.

12. Pews and common surfaces will be disinfected between Masses.
