DOERS OF THE WORD

AS FOR ME AND MY HOUSEHOLD, WE WILL SERVE THE LORD.



TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME AUGUST 22, 2021 The second reading for today begins a five-week series of selections from James, a letter that is classified among the so-called "catholic" (or universal) epistles because they are addressed to a general audience rather than to one particular community. Today's text offers important advice for Christians of every generation. God is first cited as the author of all gifts,

and in particular, reference is made to the gift of baptism by which we have been made the "first fruits" of the new creation.

What follows is advice based on a very Jewish understanding of the "word" as an active force, operative in the world. We are reminded that unless we, too, become "doers" of the word, our claim to faith is empty. Today and in subsequent weeks the author reminds us that it is equally important to do the "works" of love, for example, by caring for the "orphans and widows in their affliction."

TODAY'S READINGS:	 First Reading – Moses directs the people to observe the commandments of the Lord (Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8). Psalm – The one who does justice will live in the presence of the Lord (Psalm 15). Second Reading – Welcome the word that you have received and become doers of the word, not hearers only (James 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27). Gospel – You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition (Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23).
