OCTOBER 30, 2022

A COMPASSIONATE GOD

Today's reading from the book of Wisdom presents an image of a patient God who "*rebuke[s] offenders little by little*" (Wisdom 12:2), an image endorsed by the psalmist, singing of how the Lord is "*slow to anger and of great kindness, and compassionate toward all his works*" (Psalm 145:8, 9). The crowd with Jesus, however, grumbles when they see Jesus's kindness and compassion extended to Zacchaeus, who was not just a tax collector, but the "*chief tax collector*"—a title that surely emphasizes his standing as a sinner to be scorned. In the second reading, Saint Paul urges the Thessalonians to be "*worthy*" of God's calling, so that "*the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you*" (2 Thessalonians 1:12); such people, unlike the crowd in the Gospel, would rejoice at Zacchaeus's determination to change his life after encountering Jesus.

TODAY'S Readings:	First Reading – Lord, you love all things that exist (Wisdom $11:22 - 12:2$). Psalm – I will praise your name forever, my king and my God (Psalm 145). Second Reading – May the name of Christ be glorified in you and you in him (2 Thessalonians $1:11 - 2:2$). Gospel – Zacchaeus, a tax collector, considered to be a sinner, is converted to the Lord (Luke 19:1-10).


